# LETTER FROM OUR President

As we end 2021, I would like to look back at some of what our MCRW members accomplished during the past year. We began our year with an interesting meeting with Cat Parks, the Vice Chair of the Republican Party of Texas. We learned so much about the many initiatives the RPT has undertaken to increase the number of Republican Voters.

In February, we learned about the mission of Camp Hope. As part of our Caring for America project, we collected towels for the men at Camp Hope. I was so proud of our MCRW members for their participation in this project. I think our Camp Hope representative was surprised at the number of towels our ladies brought in.

Also in February, several MCRW members attended the TFRW Legislative Day in Austin and learned more about the issues being addressed in the Texas Legislature.

In March, we assisted with the Life and Liberty event. Hundreds of people attended this pro-life event. Our speaker at our March meeting was Robbi Hull, Vice President Legislation of the Texas Federation of Republican Women. She discussed several issues being considered in the Texas Legislature and told us how we could influence legislation.

Our April meeting featured our Montgomery County Tax Assessor/Collector Tammy McRae. She gave a very informative presentation about the works of her office.

In May, we held our Baby Shower for the Pregnancy Assistance Center/North. Our members brought in baby items to be given to the new parents served by the PACN. And once again, our members response was amazing. Our speaker at the meeting was author Loren Spivak.

In June we heard from Tim Conner with the Montgomery County Sheriff's office. He spoke about the crime in our area and issues facing the Sheriff's department. We also began planning the MCRW fundraiser in June.

We took a much needed break in July, but August found us back at work. Announcements were made regarding our fundraiser. We presented scholarships to two outstanding high school graduates. We heard from Sheriff Roy Boyd from Goliad County and our own Sheriff Rand Henderson. The crisis on our border was the main topic of the presentation. MCRW members brought in disinfectant wipes to be given to those who are working on the border. MCRW also purchased red ink pens with our club's name on them to be given out at the TFRW Convention in October.

In September, some of our members attended the National

Federation of Republican Women Convention in Orlando where MCRW was presented with the Diamond Award for our achievements during the past 2 years. Our speaker at our MCRW meeting was Judge Wayne Mack. He spoke on suicide and how we can identify those who need our help.

October was a busy month for our members. Several members were delegates to the Texas Federation of Republican Women Convention in Round Rock. At the convention, Pearl Maggio was reelected as District Director for Senate District 4 and I was reelected as TFRW Vice President Programs. This gives MCRW a voice at the TFRW Board of Directors meetings. Our Murder Mystery fundraiser was also held in October. This fundraiser proved to be quite successful as our profit was more than expected and everyone seemed to have a great time. Our profit from our fundraiser was just over \$30,000. The profits from this fundraiser will help fund our club's activities for the next 2 years.

In late October, we visited God's Garage, another of our Caring for America projects. We presented God's Garage with gift cards our members had collected. These gift cards will be given to the women who receive cars and will allow them to purchase gasoline or other needed items.

Our November meeting once again featured a speaker from Camp Hope. MCRW presented him with a check for \$2500. We also honored our veterans at that meeting. We also sent a check to Wreaths Across America to help in honoring our deceased veterans.

This has indeed been a busy year for MCRW and 2022 promises to be even busier since it is an election year. I hope you renew your membership for 2022 and join us as we are Working to Keep Texas Red. ## Legislation

### LEGISLATIVE CHAIR REPORT



Let's recap some of the legislation of interest passed during the recent special sessions of the Texas Legislature.

Second Special Session:

1.Election reform - Senate Bill 1. Bans drive-thru and 24-hour voting. Extends early voting hours. Gives greater power to poll watchers.

- 2.Bond reform Senate Bill 6. Personal bond cannot be granted if a suspect is charged with a violent crime or is already out on bail.
- 3. Border security House Bill 9. \$1.88 billion was added to increase border security efforts, including continuation of building the border wall.
- 4. Social media censorship House Bill 20. Protection of political views on social media. Bans censorship of political views.
- 5. Abortion pills Senate Bill 4. Limits access to abortion-inducing pills to women who are 7 weeks pregnant or less.

6. Virtual learning - Senate Bill 15. Texas students who pass the STA-AR exam have access to virtual learning for the next two years.

Third Special Session:

- 1. Transgender student athletes
   House Bill 25. Student athletes
  must compete as the sex they
  were born as. Meant to protect
  girls in sports from unfair competition.
- 2.Redistricting. Governor Abbott has approved the new maps for Texas congressional, legislative, and State Board of Education districts. If no court intervenes, these new districts will be used for the next ten years (until the next census is taken).

**NOVEMBER 4, 2021** 



President Alice Melancon called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m. with 39 members and 13 guests present. After the PRAYER and PLEDGES to our flags led by Cindy Miller, Alice welcomed everyone to the meeting. She recognized elected officials, candidates for office and guests. The September meeting MINUTES were approved as printed; the TREASURER'S REPORT will be filed for financial review.

In the PRESIDENT'S COM-MENTS, Alice noted that our club delegates to the TFRW Convention in Round Rock were part of a very successful statewide event, hearing many elected officials and candidates for state offices speak during the three days. At the Awards Luncheon, MCRW was presented the prestigious Achievement Award for accomplishments during the past two years. In addition, delegates in attendance elected the TFRW officers for 2022-23.

Our keynote speaker, Zack Alexander of Camp Hope, related a very inspiring story (including his own personal experience) of how Camp Hope, which is on five acres in the Northwest Houston area, helps veterans with PTSD. Camp Hope is a part of the PTSD Foundation housing up to about 80 or 90 veterans while they go through a six-month program of recovery from war and adjusting back into society after their military service. After Mr. Alexander spoke, our club presented him a \$2500 donation for Camp Hope.

In COMMITTEE REPORTS, Amy Byers of Caring for America re-

ported on a successful visit to God's Garage, another nonprofit organization that MCRW sponsors. Our club presented a car to one of their benefactors, a single mother trying to provide for her family. We also gave God's Garage \$640 in gift cards for other single mothers, widows and wives of deployed military personnel whom they assist. Pearl Maggio asked all members to turn in to her their volunteer political hours recently attained. Barbara Eddleman (Membership) asked everyone to fill out 2022 membership forms and turn them in to her along with dues for next vear.

In other UNFINISHED BUSINESS besides her earlier comments on the TFRW Convention, Alice was pleased to report that we had about 160 people at our biennial fundraiser and made a profit of around \$30,000 to be used for our programs in the next two years. She thanked

everyone who attended and all those who had a part in putting on such a successful event.

In NEW BUSINESS, Alice said that our members are so happy to honor our area veterans at this meeting. She asked all the veterans present to introduce themselves and relate to us their past military service. Next, our MCRW officers for 2022 were elected by acclamation from the slate presented by

the Nominating Committee.


