COMMITTEE UPDATES

Legislative Committee: Karen Callanan

Day 60 of the 140 days for the 89th Texas Legislative Session is March 14, 2025 the last day to file legislation: Deadline for the unrestricted filing of bills and joint resolutions other than local bills, emergency appropriations, and emergency matters by the governor. So, bills assigned to committees will be left to die or move rapidly now that the filing deadline has arrived.

Remember LT. Governor Dan Patrick has his 25 priorities for this session and hit the ground running. The Texas Senate consists of 31 members. So, the process is usually at a faster pace than the Texas House of Representatives with 150 members. The Governors "emergency items" are moving through the Senate and sent to the House. Then, they must work through differences before being sent to the Governor for signing. It has been observed that Speaker Burrows is reaching out to the Lt. Governor and Governor to work out the Voucher bills and Property taxes. Speaker Burrows is very savvy, a straight shooter and very organized with the political talent for turning no votes into yes votes. He is a peace maker. Lt. Governor respects this, reporter for Texas Trib mentioned. So, all three get along as social conservatives, as reported by the Texas Tribune.


Immigration is front and center. House says no to gambling in Texas. The lottery process will be cleaned up.

March 12th, I watched the Texas Senate live and Senator Lois Kolkhorst presented SB 25, Nutrition Education re standards for food both manufactured and sold in Texas. While labeling for informed Consent to consumers. Additives that other countries do not permit in their food will be permitted only on a limited basis. It passed unanimously to Make Texas Healthy Again! Right before the vote Senator Creighton asked to be named a Co-Sponsor of SB25. Texas Federal of Republican Women (TFRW) 2024 VEP Update Alice Melancon

-According to the TFRW PRESS RELEASE, the TFRW Voter Engagement Program (VEP) made up of MCRW and other clubs around the county and state, made a significant impact in Texas and in key battleground States. In 2024, TFRW made over 1 million calls and registered over 193,000 new Republican voters in Texas. Battleground states were secured, in part by the help of TFRW members, who registered 359,534 voters, which resulted in 290,061 Republican votes. Caring for America/Armed Services Beverly Wright & Donna Norling, -MCRW is collecting food for retired vets, clothing (new undergarments) for the Montgomery County Women's Center (MCWC), a box for retired flags. Boxes are located by the membership sign-in sheets at the general meetings. MCWC donations will only be gathered through March 2025.

-The 89th Legislative session in Texas is in session. Governor Greg Abbott continues to seek approval of his legislative priorities (property tax relief, water infrastructure investment, teacher pay raises, expand career training, school choice, bail reform and creating a Texas Cyber Command). There are thousands of cantinas/bars operating in the Houston area that financially profit by exploiting primarily young immigrant women to "pay off" smuggling debt. The TBAC is working with federal, state and local law enforcement to shut down these illegal operations, which are controlled primarily by Cartel families operating in Mexico.
