## ***A Message from our President*** ***Virginia Miller***



We are off to a great start this January of 2023!! The next two years will be very trying times for America, as we slog through the remainder of the Biden-Harris term. The incompetency and failing policies of this administration are a “call to action” for all who love freedom and American leadership on the world stage. Newsmax reports that about 3.1% of Republicans have relocated to a red state in the last three years, **in order to live in a region that aligns more closely with their beliefs**. About 7.1% of Republicans are expected to move to a red state in the next year, for the same reason! About 211,000 have moved to Texas so far. In the last two weeks, we have seen an amazing series of events unfold on live television. Damar Hamlin, a 24-year old safety with the Buffalo Bills, collapsed on the field with cardiac arrest. As paramedics fought to keep him alive with CPR, both teams gathered on their knees, not to protest, but to pray for Hamlin’s life! An ESPN anchor prayed for him on live TV. For days, sports and news commentators on every network asked for prayers, that God would save Hamlin, and millions of Americans prayed.

For the past decade, we have seen coaches fired for praying with their teams. Teachers have been reprimanded for wearing a cross necklace, or mentioning God in the classroom. I believe in miracles, and we saw one this week, when Damar Hamlin awakened, in sound mind, and thanked all who had prayed for his healing. 

The meeting was CALLED TO ORDER by President Alice Melancon at 11:30 a.m. with 45 members and 2 guests present. Virginia Miller (Chaplain/Americanism Chairperson) led us in PRAYER and the PLEDGES to our flags. Alice welcomed everyone and recognized elected officials. The October meeting MINUTES were approved as printed; the TREASURER'S REPORT will be filed for financial review.

In the PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS, Alice recognized that today we'll be having our installation of new officers for 2023 and that we'll all participate in putting together welcome bags for Fisher House residents. Alice mentioned that Republicans represented 51% of the national vote in the November General Election. Both our State of Texas and also Montgomery County elected all Republicans to office. We've also gained control of the U. S. House of Representatives. Alice introduced our current MCRW Board and thanked them for their service throughout the past two years. She highlighted all the MCRW accomplishments and activities throughout 2022. ## TEXAS LEGISLATURE IS NOW IN SESSION

Lawmakers began work on January 10, 2023 for their biennial legislative session. The State Legislature will meet for 140 days in regular session. During this time, they'll debate over the state budget, school issues, border security and property taxes, among other issues. They will pass laws and decide how to spend the state's money for the next two years.

The Republican Party of Texas has identified its top priorities for this legislative session. Here are the official 2023 Texas GOP Legislative Priorities as identified by the Republican Party of Texas

2. Secure the Border and Protect Texans
3. Ban Gender Modification of Children
4. Stop Sexualizing Texas Kids




**Representative Will Metcalf**
