Our speaker this month, Sheriff Roy Boyd, is the Sheriff of Goliad County. Sheriff Boyd says he calls Homeland Security Agents daily to share information and stop the illegal activities passing through to his county. He adds, although the Goliad County Sheriff's Office

doesn't enforce immigration law, it is often overwhelmed "by the complex transnational criminal organizations who are moving slaves from foreign countries" into its jurisdiction. This activity puts the safety of local landowners at risk, and also puts those being

trafficked in danger; issues his officers address range from trespassing to theft, property damage, and lives endangered.

We will also be hearing from our own Sheriff, Rand Henderson in his efforts to keep Montgomery County safe. The August meeting will be one you don't want to miss.

One hundred and one years ago on August 18, 1920, the women's suffrage movement finally reached its goal of ratification by the States of the 19th Amendment granting women the right to vote in US elections. In the 1860s, supporters for woman suffrage began to pressure Congress for the right to vote. This achievement was a long time in the making. The first woman suffrage amendment was introduced in Congress in 1878, and for the next

RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT

40 years it was reintroduced regularly, becoming popularly known as the Susan B. Anthony Amendment. Finally, in 1919 Congress passed the 19th Amendment guaranteeing women the right to vote, which three-fourths of the states ratified by August 18, 1920.

Importantly, Republicans led the charge in the introduction and approval of this important and overdue amendment. On May 21, 1919, James Mann, an Illinois Republican, reintroduced the 19th Amendment in the House of Representatives and it passed by a vote of 304 to 89, with over 200 Republi-

cans and 102 Democrats voting in favor of the 19th Amendment. Similarly, on June 4, 1919, the 19th Amendment passed the Senate by a vote of 56 to 25 with 82% of Republicans and 41% of Democrats voting in favor.

The very next year in March of 1920, 36 states ratified the 19th Amendment. Out of those 36 states that ratified, 26 were Republican and 10 Democrat. Following ratification, over eight million women voted in the November presidential election that same year and Republican Warren G. Harding won the Presidency by 26.2%

In COMMITTEE REPORTS beginning with Literacy/Scholarship, Alice reported how well qualified our two young lady scholarship winners are. Carla Reyes Ortiz, a leader in The Woodlands College Park High School, in addition to having very high grades and a regular job, is a member of many honorary organizations. She plans to attend TX A&M Uni-

versity and major in bio-medical science and then go on to medical school in order to be a doctor with the U.S. Navy. Ashley Gibson of The Woodlands High School also has very high grades, is on her HS golf team, plays the violin in the school orchestra, has earned the Girl Scout Gold Award, and also holds a regular job. She has recently joined the Texas State National Guard and will also be attending TX A&M University. Concerning our upcoming October fundraiser to be held at River Plantation Golf Club. Suzanne Adams announced that individual \$60 ticket and sponsorship sales will begin in August along with collection of silent auction donations by Pearl Maggio and her committee. At the fundraiser a very nice dinner will be served and entertainment will be a spooky murder mystery play. The play actors will be our local elected officials.

PROGRAM Chairperson Suzanne Adams introduced our

keynote speaker Captain Tim Cannon, a highly decorated officer of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. In other ANNOUNCEMENTS, there will be no board or general meeting in July. The Board will meet on August 12th, and the next general meeting will be August 26th. The TX Youth Summit Dinner will be July 17th, and the Youth Summit will be August 27-28 at Mims Baptist Church in Conroe. The TFRW Board of Directors will meet in Georgetown on July 16-17.

TEXAS LEGISLATIVE SPECIAL SESSIONS



With the first special session ended and the second one already called, I thought some facts about special legislative sessions in Texas might be of interest.

First, only the Governor of Texas may call for a special session. The Governor may convene a special session at any time, as many times as he/she feels necessary, and for any reason. No advance notice is required.

Second, each special session has no minimum length of time but cannot exceed 30 days. One special session lasted only one hour!

Next, the Governor sets the top-

ics to be considered. No other topics may be introduced.

Further, a break between special sessions is not required.

Finally, the authority for the Governor to call a special session is the Texas Constitution.

Soon, we should know what legislation, if any, gets passed during the course of the special sessions.

TFRW Statement on Critical Race Theory

There has been much discussion regarding TFRW's position on the Bills in the Texas Legislation regarding Critical Race Theory. TFRW issued a press release on its position. I want to be sure you are all aware of it in case anyone questions you.

STATEMENT ON CRITICAL RACE THEORY

AUSTIN, TX) — Glynis Chester, President of the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW), issued the following statement regarding Critical Race Theory:

"TFRW does NOT support Critical Race Theory (CRT). All of TFRW's statements, Action Alerts, and newsletter articles clearly have stated TFRW's position. TFRW wants to see CRT prohibited in ALL grades and in ALL subjects. Unfortunately, the bill that was passed during the regular session (HB3979) did not accomplish this. That is why the Governor added it to the Special Session.

TFRW has NOTHING to do with iCivics or any curriculum provider, iCivics is one of many entities that provides curriculum in the state of Texas, Florida and other states around the country, iCivics does NOT provide CRT curriculum. TFRW does NOT support the inclusion of any curriculum provider, iCivics or otherwise, in any education statute.

CRT needs to be abolished from the intellectual marketplace, but accomplishing this will require Republicans to work together. It is important to check facts BEFORE circulating information. Journalistic integrity is an oxymoron and Republicans should be less eager to believe the worst about fellow conservatives."

Sheriff Boyd says he calls Homeland Security Agents daily to share information and stop the illegal activities passing through to his county. He adds, although the Goliad County Sheriff's Office doesn't enforce immigration law, it is often overwhelmed "by the complex transna-

tional criminal organizations who are moving slaves from foreign countries" into its jurisdiction. This activity puts the safety of local landowners at risk, and also puts those being trafficked in danger; issues his officers address theft, property damage, and lives endangered.

In an effort to protect the members of the Goliad Sheriff's Department, MCRW will be donating disinfecting wipes to the Sheriff's Department. Any members who would like to do-

nate wipes are encouraged to bring them to our August meeting.

We will also be donating wipes to the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department since 7 deputies from the department are stationed at the border.


